DHL Relay Race – exercise and social interaction

The University of Copenhagen's tent was also a fine sight in Fælledparken. But maybe we should come up with a special cheer next year befitting of Denmark's largest knowledge institution. So don your thinking caps, suggestions are always welcome!

There was an excellent atmosphere in the tent – the grilled sausages and the draught beer were delicious. But we should probably make sure to have a couple of extra kegs on hand next year, because apparently some of the final runners didn't get any. However that wasn't going to put a damper on their spirits. As one runner said to me: "I didn't run fast enough, so I didn't get any beer. But that's OK. I ran because I enjoyed too many beers over the summer."

The DHL Relay Race is a fine combination of exercise and social interaction. And while the University is made up of a lot of little teams, the atmosphere in the tent and all the rosy cheeks showed that we are also one big team.

Gabino Casas Casanova has compiled some statistics for the University's participation in DHL 2009:

Teams and runners

The University of Copenhagen registered 319 teams, corresponding to 1,595 runners (approx. 30 per cent more than in 2008).

272 teams received final times, i.e. there were a number of teams that completed the race but forgot to hand in chips (we found lots of chips in the tents).

From the Faculty of Life Sciences (LIFE), 64 teams were registered (via the LIFE staff association), corresponding to 320 runners.

In the category 2 men, 3 women, team no. 52 'KU-LIFE- IHE-Klinisk.Eksp.Ernæring' came in tenth place.

Sometime this week, we expect the University of Copenhagen Administration to compile the University's overall results lists, including the winners from among the University's teams.

Tents and people

Like last year, the University sponsored the tents and T-shirts.

There were two tents with room for 1,440 and 288, respectively, giving a total of 1,728 people (approx. 33 per cent more places than in 2008).

We estimate that there were approx. 2,000 runners and supporters in and around the tents throughout the evening (approx. 33 per cent more than in 2008).

Eat, drink and be merry

40 kegs of organic beer (760 l) were emptied before 9 pm (approx. 43 per cent more beer was consumed than in 2008).

Approx. 3,100 organic sausages + rolls were consumed (approx. 20 per cent more than in 2008).

Approx. 1,000 apples, pears and bananas were consumed (approx. 50 per cent more than in 2008).

750 l of mineral water with the University logo were consumed (approx. 25 per cent more than in 2008).

People enjoyed innumerable cans and bottles of their own beer as well as mineral water from the DHL 'picnic baskets'.

Lots of wine in cartons was consumed (but a lot remained unopened).

A great deal of surplus and unopened food (not red wine) was donated to Copenhagen's shelters for the homeless.

We thank everyone for their support in gathering together all the surplus food!

Climate scholars welcomed at Café Væksthuset

The recipients of the COP15 climate scholarships have now arrived in Denmark from all over the world. On Tuesday 1 September, they were welcomed at Café Væksthuset by Danish Minister for Development Cooperation Ulla Tørnæs and Danish Minister for Science, Technology and Innovation Helge Sander.

The climate scholarships have been created using the money the Danish government has saved by deciding not to hand out the usual gifts and conference material at the climate conference.

Experience shows that conference gifts often end up in the rubbish bins at hotels and conference centres. And with 15,000 participants, this amounts to significant financial, environmental and resource-related savings.

The approx. DKK 4 million saved has instead financed travel costs, accommodation and two years of climate studies at five Danish Universities for 11 young students. Most come from the developing countries that are facing special challenges because of climate change.

With more than 800 applicants from all over the world, the climate scholarships have called attention to Denmark as an attractive place to study.

Kick-start Erasmus activities in the new academic year

Institutions of higher education that need to establish new agreements on internships and study stays or who are working on an application for an intensive programme or a multilateral project can apply via CIRIUS for preparatory visits.

If you need to visit your European partners to conclude agreements on Erasmus collaborations, it is possible to apply for subsidies to cover travel expenses and accommodation for a so-called preparatory visit.

Application

The application deadline for preparatory visits is ongoing, however applications must be submitted no later than one month before the start date of the visit. It is not possible to submit applications after 15 November 2009.

The application form for preparatory visits must be completed online on the CIRIUS website.

Foreningen PLAN DANMARK – deadline for applications: 1 October

As in previous years, the above foundation is awarding a number of grants in the order of DKK 5,000-10,000 in December 2009.

The aim of the grants is, among other things, to improve the education of young farmers and students at the Faculty of Life Sciences who, for example, would like to study at a university abroad for a semester. Financial support for travel and living expenses is provided.

The application must be for studies abroad starting *after* the deadline for application; starting studies abroad in

September 2009, however, is acceptable.

Applications without correct academic records stating all marks and exam attempts and a specified budget will not be considered.

Applications received after the deadline will not be considered.

Signed applications must be submitted to the Faculty of Life Sciences/University of Copenhagen, Study and Students' Affairs, Bülowsvej 17, 1870 Frederiksberg C, Denmark, by Thursday 1 October 2009 at the latest.

Letters of rejection will not be sent, but the awarding of the grant will be announced in eLIFE.
